"I know those of you that know me well are looking for my daily rally updates about things that happen at the greatest show on earth. However this year, due to everything that has happened in regards to iaw enforcement, and out of respect for my friends and family who may not be overly supportive of my chosen calling, I will not be posting much. However, sitting here on the porch reflecting on day two, I feel like I should share what happened at bar close last night downtown.

The bars closed at 2 like they always do and a large number of folks gathered in the street, just like any other night. However this night turned out to be way different. Instead of grabbing some overpriced fried food and staggering off into the sunrise, one man fired up the loud stereo on his Harley and started dancing. Within seconds, the entire street was filled with people from all walks of life and Nationalities dancing right along with him. The street was filled with people enjoying their freedom together, and not wanting it to end. We let this go on for about 20 minutes or so before we had to clear the street. When we went in to stop the party, there was no rioting, no looting, and no violence. just an overwhelming support for us as they quietly left. We got fist bumps, high fives, handshakes, and hundreds of selfies and well wishes for us and our profession. A couple guys even tried to tip us for our service.

For a short time on Main Street Sturgis, we were all Americans, not liberals, not conservatives, and our skin color didn't matter, we were all together, and months of anxiety, anger, divisiveness, and fear melted away right before my eyes. Even as I type this 8 hours later, I am still moved by what happened on that street in Sturgis SD.

Legislative Report Skee Dodson, State Legislative Officer, Texas Abate Confederation, Inc.

We are setting record temperatures in North Texas as we approach the end of August - record <u>low</u> temperatures, that is! This last week we enjoyed highs in the upper 80's, and lows in the upper 60's. And today, in my neighborhood, the high is forecast for 92 degrees! Wow, enjoy this awesome weather while we can, because in a couple of months we'll asking if it's too early to put up holiday trees! Cooler weather is just around the corner, for sure, but that isn't all – our 87th Texas legislative session is just around the corner too!

Our legislative session begins in approximately four months and is approaching fast; I hope everyone reading this is making plans to attend our motorcycle legislative lobby day on January 25th! This year we hope to have thousands of motorcycle freedom fighters at the Capitol - representing the nearly half million registered motorcycles in Texas. Make your plans now to join us in Austin on January 25th.

As we get closer to our legislative session, we need to make appointments to meet with our elected officials in Austin. As I mentioned in previous issues of Tidbits, it is getting to be a bit of a challenge to receive any correspondence back from your representatives. I know many of us have written several emails lately (inc. snail-mail) and have gotten very few replies. Do not be discouraged, keep sending requests to meet with them. Even if you cannot personally meet with your rep, many of us can - and will. It is time for some common-sense motorcycle legislation in Texas!

To find out who represents you, go to https://wrm.capitol.texas.gov/home. Find out what voting district you reside in (write it down), and who your representatives are; go to their website and get to know your reps. Remind them that you are their constituent and that there are thousands of registered motorcycles in their district! Send the email, start the dialog, and make the appointment (anytime, any day)! You probably remember, last session Texas passed SB-616 – transferring the responsibility of administering the basic motorcycle training course (the "Course") away from the Texas Department of Public Safety (Tx DPS) – and transferring it to the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (Tx TDLR). You are required to pass this course for a motorcycle endorsement in Texas. This new legislation also transfers the responsibility of administering the motorcycle safety fund (0501) to the TDLR.

S.B. 616 amends the Transportation Code to remove the requirement for the governor to designate an entity to establish and administer a motorcycle operator training and safety program and an off-highway vehicle operator education and certification program. The bill requires the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) instead to administer those programs and enforce the laws governing those programs. The bill includes institutions of higher education among the entities that may be contracted with to assist in the administration of the education program and the certification of off-highway vehicle operators.

S.B. 616 requires the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation (TCLR) to establish by rule minimum curriculum standards for courses provided under the motorcycle operator training and safety program, requires TDLR to approve all courses that meet the established curriculum standards, and sets out provisions relating to the establishment of the minimum curriculum standards for entry-level courses. The bill authorizes TCLR to set fees in amounts reasonable and necessary to cover the costs of administering the motorcycle operator training and safety program, including fees for the issuance and renewal of a motorcycle school license and instructor license and courses provided under the program. The bill requires TCLR to establish a nine-member advisory board to advise TDLR on matters related to the program. The bill sets out the board's composition and provides for its administration and operation. The bill repeals provisions relating to a program director and a motorcycle safety coordinator.

S.B. 616 revises and sets out provisions related to the following:

- TDLR contracts with motorcycle schools, including required consultation with the motorcycle safety advisory board;
- the prohibition against unauthorized training in motorcycle operation;
- · eligibility to obtain, and the application process for, a motorcycle operation and safety instructor license;
- the denial, suspension, or revocation of an instructor or motorcycle school license; and
- · reporting requirements for motorcycle schools.

The bill requires the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service, in consultation with TDLR, to administer the training program to obtain an instructor license and provides for the issuance of a certificate of completion of the training program.

S .B. 616 authorizes TDLR to establish and administer a grant program to improve motorcycle safety in Texas using money from the motorcycle education fund account and sets out provisions related to awarding and administering the grant program. The bill authorizes TDLR to apply for and accept gifts, grants, and donations from any organization to be deposited in the motorcycle education fund account for such purposes. The bill requires the Texas A&M Transportation Institute, in consultation with TDLR, to research motorcycle safety in Texas and provide advocacy and education to the public on that topic.

Skee Dodson, Texas ABATE Legislative Officer and the Legislative team of the Texas COC&I are working diligently toward the planning and details of the upcoming legislative session and getting bills authored, sponsored and ready for us to present and share on January 25th, 2021, at Legislative Day. Hotel details for Legislative Day in Austin will be available in the next newsletter and information will be updated as it is received on the Texas Legislative Day Facebook group (https://www.facebook.com/groups/TexasLegislativeDay/); you can watch the Texas ABATE Confederation website (https://texasabate.com/) and the Texas ABATE Facebook (https://www.facebook.com/groups/texasabate/) group for details as well.

We only have until the end of September to get your State Officer Nominations in for Assistant Coordinator, Treasurer, Newsletter Editor, and Membership Officer for the 2021-2023 term, for our December election. If you, or someone you know, wants to help by leading a team, please get with your Chapter Representative.

You can make your nomination for any of these positions in a couple different ways; if your membership is with one of the Chapters, contact your Chapter Representative (Board Member), or make your nomination at a business meeting, or via email to your Chapter Rep. If you are not a member of a Chapter, be sure to check the Independent Corner of this newsletter for important election information.

Chapter Members will vote at a chapter meeting, and the Chapter Rep will take the vote to the December Board Meeting to cast your chapter vote for the four (4) open Officer positions.

How are we all doing with our research for voting for the best candidate on November 3rd? This Presidential Election is so very important, be sure you are registered to vote (visit https://www.votetexas.gov/) if you're unsure and do your research, search your issues and see what candidate can best address those important to you.

Legislative Report Continued

S.B. 616 provides for the transition of the administration and enforcement of the motorcycle operator training and safety program and the off-highway vehicle operator education and certification program from the DPS to TDLR on September 1, 2020, including providing that all DPS FTE positions that primarily concern the administration or enforcement of the licensing program become TDLR positions.

S.B. 616 requires DPS, not later than August 31, 2020, to dispose of motorcycles and other equipment related to the motorcycle operator training and safety program that DPS possesses or has leased to entities offering training under the program and sets out related provisions...

As a member of Texas ABATE, I testified at the Sunset Advisory Commission DPS review board's hearing last year (5/19). I testified that we are optimistic that any new motorcycle-training program initiated in Texas will be: 1) more efficient, 2) reduce the number of unendorsed riders in our state, and 3) ultimately reduce the number of motorcycle fatalities in Texas.

As we are submitting our qualified nominations for open positions for Chapter and Corporate Officers, below are a few reminders/tips:

- 1. Article III Chapters Officers § A § 2 Chapter members must be in good standing for a period of six (6) months before serving as an officer.
- 2. Article IV Corporate Elections § C Candidates for open positions must be current members in good standing for a period of six (6) months, and may accept the nomination either in person, by phone, written notice, or via electronic communications.
- 3. Article IV Corporate Elections § D Board members [Chapter and Independent Representatives] are to vote at the last Corporation meeting of the calendar year [for 2020 will be the December meeting].
- 4. Article IV Corporate Elections § F The Independent Representative will be elected by a vote of the independent members only.

As you know, due to COVID-19, Texas ABATE gave members an extension period to pay membership dues this year. For those members who expired January-June 2020, dues had to be paid by July 1, 2020. Therefore, any member who expired January 1 -June 30, 2020, and did not pay their membership dues by July 1, 2020, would not be a member in good standing for a period of six (6) months nor a valid nomination for an open Corporate officer position.

As to a Chapter officer position, the Chapter member would have to be a current member, in good standing, from July 1 – December 31, in order to take a Chapter office in January of the following calendar year.

The Independent Rep sits on the Board of Directors as the voice of the Independent Members; the duty of the Independent Representative is to keep the line of communication open between the ABATE Board and our Independent Members, to bring the Independent Members all information regarding Legislative issues and actions, and to bring to the Board your concerns, suggestions, ideas and such.


