Attended a Town Hall Meeting put on by Congressman Michael Burgess on August 2nd. After the meeting, I thanked him for supporting some of our motorcycle bills, being part of the motorcycle committee, and for his guest appearance at the Mid-South M.I.L.E. last year.

Burgess is well aware of our need for his support for the bill (HR 7731) that will ensure the E85 label remains on the pumps. He did ask if I used E85 in my motorcycle. I do not. I do not want my engine to burn up. My son told me about some gas stations in the DFW area that were shutting down their E85 pumps. Basically, due to the price difference, people were filling up their tanks with E85 gas which burned up the engines. So, we need the bill to go thru to make sure the E85 label stays on the pumps.



Legislative Report

Let's congratulate New Hampshire, as it became the 5th State to pass a motorcycle profiling law! Wow, 10 House members sponsored this "Prohibiting Motorcycle Profiling" bill. HB 1000 passed both chambers, and it was signed into law! Great job New Hampshire Motorcycle Task Force, and everyone involved - congrats!

Congratulations also go out to the Motorcycle Rider's Foundation (MRF),

who recently got inducted into the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum & Hall of Fame! How awesome is it that the MRF was recognized for our motorcycle "Freedom Fighter" achievements on a National level?! This means every MRF member is also a member of the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum & Hall of Fame! Every MRF member should be proud of our many accomplishments and now for our induction into the Hall of Fame! If you are not a member of the MRF, ask yourself: why not? If you need more information, ask any MRF member, or me. Read more about the MRF induction in a separate release from Hardtail - elsewhere in this issue.

As I mentioned last month, we need prepare for the Texas (88th) Legislative Session, which is less than 5 months away. The 1st day of the 88th session is January 10th, 2023 - make plans now to participate! However, we also can't ignore that the (US) 117th Congress is almost over - and we still have business to take care of before the end of the year. Most importantly, I am referring to H.Res. 366 – a resolution "Promoting awareness of motorcyclist profiling and encouraging collaboration and communication with the motorcycle community and law enforcement officials to prevent instances of profiling". I know, this resolution has a long name, but it pretty much sums it up. Profiling bikers because of what they ride or the apparel they wear is illegal! The Senate passed an identical resolution a while back and now it is time for the House to do the same.

This is an extremely important resolution which deserves a full House vote! Go to <u>mrf.org</u>, and navigate to Federal Legislative Issues; we need to take legislative action on this urgent Federal resolution while we still can. Passing this motorcycle profiling resolution will help us promote a profiling bill next session in Texas – together, we can do this!

Texas motorcyclists are optimistic that we will become the 6th State to pass a motorcycleprofiling bill – next session! We are also very optimistic that Texas will pass a gang database reform bill, as it passed the full House chamber last session. The Texas Council of Clubs & Independents (TCOC&I) deserve all the credit for introducing these two bills into legislation and, in unity, we will get them passed into law!

Texas ABATE is hopeful to introduce a couple of different motorcycle bills next session; one being the "Definition of a Motorcycle" - as our current definition in the Texas Transportation Code is decades old. Texas is still OK with motorcycles having steering wheels and bench seating (autocycles)! Other proposed ABATE bills include a familiar Malfunctioning Red Light bill and, recently considered, "Lane Filtering" bill. Gaining support for (CONTINUED ON PAGE 4)

a lane-filtering bill will be our greatest challenge, but it can be done.

In a 2011 study, the National Highway Traffic Administration (NHTSA) found that lane-filtering could reduce fatal rear-end motorcycle crashes by more than 5%. In Texas, 5% fewer fatalities would save 10-15 lives per year! In the same study, NHTSA concluded that: "it is highly unlikely that a motorcycle rider would be able to avoid a pending contact to the rear of their motorcycle". A vehicle traveling at 35 mph is traveling 51 feet per second. It takes 4.25 seconds to get out of the way of an approaching vehicle that is 2 seconds behind you! A rider looking in the rearview mirror does not perceive danger until it is too late, even in bestcase scenarios. Approximately 30% of motorcycle multi-vehicle crash fatalities are caused by rear-end collisions - and distracted driving continually adds to this percentage.

Texas ABATE is holding our 25th Annual State Rally, September 9-11, (Kerfoot Rd) in Bells, Texas. Everyone is invited – whether you ride or not! This is also our Texas ABATE General Membership meeting, and all members are urged to attend. Live bands, food vendors, free camping, and much! We'll discuss membership topics, as well as discuss legislative issues. I hope to see everyone at the rally!

Finally, September 21-25, Texas is planning to attend the Motorcycle Riders Foundation's 38th Annual "Meeting of the Minds" in Des Moines, lowa. I hope to see many of us there (make plans now)!

IT'S THE LAW OF COMMON SENSE

I was thinking to myself that in some respects 2022 is looking better than 2021, but sometimes it may be getting worse, especially when it comes to people's Common Sense. As this year marches forward, I see more people not wanting to step up to the plate and volunteer a little of their time to help someone or support an event that benefits all of us. They do not have a problem with paying dues to become a member, but when it comes to volunteering time to the organization that they joined and be actively involved, no hands are raised.

In last month's Tidbits, our legislative officer authored an article "Doers vs Sayers" indicating that according to a survey response to a Call To Action (CTA) from the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) regarding US H. Res. 366 (Anti-Profiling House Resolution), Texas was ranked as the 4th State in the Country for contacting House reps with only 124 people taking action. Does that mean that Texas only has 124 people who may ride a motorcycle and care about motorcycle profiling? I am sure that there are more than 124 motorcyclists in Texas, and I know there are at least 400 to 500 people that are in Texas has more "Sayers" than "Doers." How do we change this? How do we get more motorcyclists enthusiastic about fighting for their rights?

Another example, even with the month of May being proclaimed as Motorcycle Safety and Awareness month in several of our cities and towns, it looks like we have a limited number of members promoting motorcycle safety and awareness. We should be encouraging everyone who puts themselves behind the wheel, to become aware of motorcyclists, regarding them with the same respect as any other vehicle traveling the highways of this country. How do we get more members involved in helping to promote motorcycle safety and awareness?

Just my opinion, but this picture and its statement says it all. What do you think? Are you along for the "FREE RIDE" or are you a person who would "HELP PULL THE WAGON"?
