Representatives from Arkansas, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Oklahoma, and Texas, all participated in the two-day event. The "M.I.L.E." stands for "Motorcyclists Improving Legislative Effectiveness," and there is no doubt that the program in Dallas lived up to its billing.

Congressman Burgess shared stories about his history in motorcycling and his efforts to combat profiling and the expansion of ethanol mandates. Congressman Burgess was the 2018 MRF Legislative Champion of the year and made sure to wear his award vest during his visit. Like similar events, the Mid-South M.I.L.E. left bikers energized and motivated to continue the fight to defend our freedoms. Thanks to the organizers who invited the MRF to attend and the volunteers who put on a fantastic event. As you might guess, the hospitality room was Texas sized with great food and drink. 

## **Legislative Report**

I have to admit, that 2021 started off as a challenge, and it didn't let up for most of the year. Looking back at 2021, we definitely had our trials and tribulations; and we continued into the New Year with more cancelled meetings and rallies. Too often we are reminded that our days with family and friends are unfairly limited. Sadly, we lost our great friend, our ABATE State Coordinator, and our Texoma Chapter founder - Bruce "Dad" Guffee. Dad was a Life Member of ABATE, and a sustaining member of the MRF. Everyone who knew Dad, especially

Texoma motorcycling community, will miss him tremendously. His legacy will live on with our Texas ABATE chapters for quite some time! We celebrated Dad as our Santa mascot for the 27<sup>th</sup> Annual "For the Kids" Toy Run on December 5<sup>th</sup>. WOW – this year was epic! GBNF... ...

2021 was a year for the record books. The challenges started in January, when we were notified that the House of Representatives members were on a "Covid break", and that they weren't expected to be at the Capitol during our "Motorcycle Legislative Day". We received restricted access to the Texas Capitol during the 87<sup>th</sup> Legislative session, and we were required to be tested for the Covid virus before we could enter the Capitol. If you wanted to meet with a House member inside the Capitol you had to first pass the Fast test, but you didn't have to wear a mask inside. If you wanted to meet with a Senator inside, you didn't have to take the Fast test, but you were required to wear a mask inside (if not Fast tested) - LOL! This legislative session also taught us that we could meet with our legislators via a "Zoom" video call. We learned that if you let the zoom call be scheduled by the Congressman's aide it will carry more "importance". We also learned that you only have one chance to "make your ask" on a zoom call - keep it factual and on point! Having only 140 legislative days during a regular session is hardly enough time to move a bill through both chambers; however, one of our motorcycle bills, HB 1838, actually did receive a full House vote - and passed unanimously. HB 1838 was received by the Senate, and HB 1837 (the House profiling bill) almost made it to the house floor for a full vote!



This has been an historic session for Texas in more ways than one. The Texas 87<sup>th</sup> legislative session had a total of 6 motorcycle bills, and one resolution. Texas is blessed with many freedom-fighting motorcycle clubs and organizations, and we were unified in our message – that we need common-sense motorcycle legislation!

Summer, in my opinion, went by way too fast! In August, a few Texas ABATE members rode to the 34th Annual "ABATE Social Hour" in Whitewood, South Dakota. This annual event is hosted by ABATE of SD and is an awesome and welcome reprieve from the crowds of the Sturgis rally. This social gives us a chance to get caught up with old friends, and new stories. Kirk "Hardtail" Willard. from the MRF, compared the House Highway Bill to the Senate version - we were hopeful that the version signed by the President would include specific motorcycle language in autonomous



vehicle studies. Now we know that this specific language will not be included in the Highway bill - or "Invest Act". It was an awesome ride home, even though the smoke of the California wildfires put a cover on everything; we couldn't see very much of the Rocky Mountains! During the entire trip it never rained once - except for the last 200 miles from home!

In September, we attended the 37<sup>th</sup> Annual Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) "Meeting of the Minds" in Atlanta, Georgia. Texas ABATE gave a state update and discussed several of our bills. I heard many combustion engine "end-oflife" stories and was shocked to hear that Europe is planning on eliminating combustion engines by 2050! If that happens, we know the rest of the world will follow. Just this summer, the Governor of California banned the sale of small combustion engines by 2024! Let's preserve the same rights we enjoy for our kids and grandkids. It's time to find good leaders and challenge them to be successful.

I always learn a lot at the *Meeting* of the Minds, and this year was no different. We set our MRF 2022 priorities and gained enough knowledge and motivation to last an entire year! In October, Texas hosted the 29<sup>th</sup> Annual Mid-South M.I.L.E. in Dallas. The M.I.L.E. (Motorcyclists Improving Legislative Effectiveness) workshops were (continued on pg 4)

packed with information geared toward protecting motorcycle rights for everyone. The special guest speaker was US Representative Michael Burgess, from Texas Congressional District 26 – who is also a cochair of the Congressional Motorcycle Caucus. Dr. Burgess wore his leather motorcycle vest and was well received by everyone! During the award ceremony, Dino Viles presented me with a special plaque at the banquet - recognizing me for my "Dedication to Freedom of Choice for All Texas Bikers". That was definitely unexpected, and totally awesome - thank you!

Overall, I would say that 2021 went by fairly quickly. I would also say that this 87th legislative session has been mostly successful for motorcyclists. However, it is vital that we take what we learned this last session and prepare our strategy for the next legislative session - which begins in January of 2023. Mark your calendars for January 22, 2022 – for the Texas ABATE "88th Legislative Session Prep" seminar (see flier). More information will follow, and everyone is encouraged to attend. Remember, we need to work smarter - not harder! Statistically, 2020 was a historically high year for vehicle fatalities, including motorcycle fatalities. I fear that these unusually high fatality trends continued right through 2021. Please be careful, and don't become a motorcycle statistic. Finally, it's the end of 2021, but there is time to log onto www.motorcycleprofilingproject.com and take the 2021 National profiling survey. No info is collected, and you only answer 6 questions - let's finish this year strong! I hope everyone parties responsibly, has a wonderful and blessed Christmas, and makes it safely to 2022 – and beyond! We have a lot of work to do next year, and I hope that everyone will participate! One of my favorite quotes is by an anonymous author: "The world is run by those who show up"! Ride safe - Ride free!


